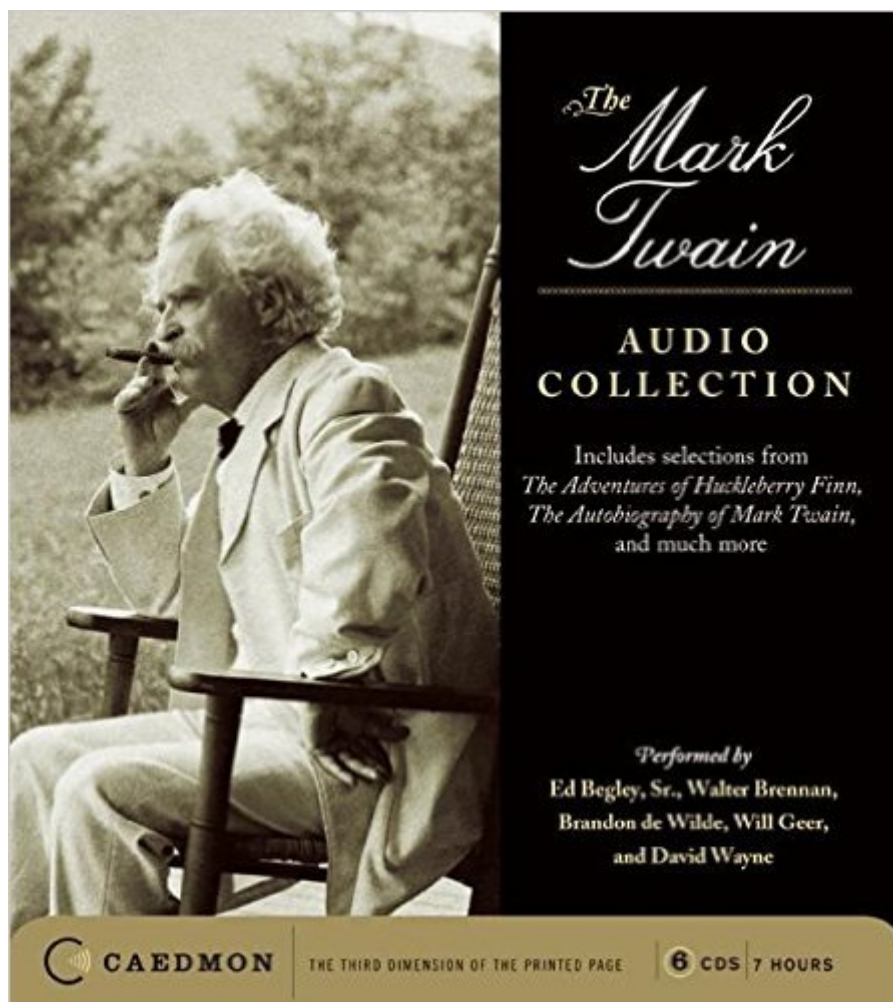

This collection presents a few of your favorite Clemens stories, just as they must have been read aloud by generations of enthralled readers. I enjoyed it greatly and wish the rest of his works were offered in the exact same format.

Life on the Mississippi is done wonderfully. The Jumping Frog of Calveras County is done with such an affected "old codger" accent that it's not funny at all, which is almost impossible for that story. Everything else spans the range. The CD is a compilation of several actors, which doubtless explains the variability.

Nothing beats Mark Twain. He was the consummate story-teller. His choice of words alone can expand your vocabulary, if nothing else. Twain was one of America's greatest writers because he wrote about his life-experiences in a vernacular that gives us insight to his era.

I am not sure what I was expecting from this collection, but I listened to it with mixed feelings. The opening CD dealing with Life on the Mississippi was probably the duller listening. It was fun to hear the material read by Will Gere and Walter Brennan. Some of the language is dated and some of the humor is slow developing, but other times Twain's clever language made me laugh out loud. It was an OK addition to my collection.
