

I like this book because it has notations for many different grooves (blues, rock, country and pop). Along with the CD that comes with it, it is very easy to follow. Each track is indicated on the book and the CD tells you which pattern will be playing on the next track. It's nice that the CD has play-along songs with and without drums. I recommend this book and another one by Rod Morgenstein called Drum Set Warm-Ups.

Since I have some ability already this book allowed me to quickly gain an understanding on so many beat varieties, fills, coloration/voicing. Many of the beats are recorded on CD with a no-nonsense approach and high quality for you to follow along and play with. There are also a number of basic song structures for you to play with, or hear Rod playing drums on. The area where this book does something beyond what other books do is how it treats drumset playing as a part of a band in a very musical setting. It explains song and music structure and helps you get ready to play with other musicians. And lastly, it's written by the great Rod Morgenstein. What more can I say!

I use this in my drum school for beginning drumset students- I love it, the students enjoy it. It is easy to read and progresses in a fun and challenging way.
